Dear Mr. Adams:

Continuously for more than one hundred fifty years, The New York Times Company (“The Times”) has published the world famous newspaper, *The New York Times*. We are the owner of U.S. Registration No. 227, 904 for our trademark “The New York Times” in the world-famous Gothic font, which registration is now incontestable.

It has come to my attention that you have created and published at <http://www.corzinetimes.com/> a web site entitled “The Corzine Times”, which is clearly intended to be nearly identical to NYTimes.com – the content being comprised of articles that the Republican Governor’s Association wishes to disseminate regarding Governor John Corzine of New Jersey, and the design, entirely copied from The Times’s NYTimes.com web site. The title for the site is designed to recall the world famous, protected *New York Times* logo, and the pages use the same fonts and layout as nytimes.com in order to mimic its design. Such copying is a clear infringement of The Times’s rights under the Copyright Act of 1976 and falsely suggests, in violation of the Lanham Act, that the Times has sponsored or is otherwise associated with your website.

Accordingly, on behalf of The New York Times, I demand that you immediately cease and desist any further use of The Times’ design, format and other intellectual property in any manner whatsoever.
