# PLAINTIFF'S OPPOSITION TO DEFENDANT'S SPECIAL MOTION TO DISMISS PURSUANT TO G.L. c. 231, § 59H

**Now comes** the Plaintiff, Ourway Realty, LLC d/b/a Plainridge Racecourse, in the above-captioned action and respectfully submits its opposition to the Defendant, Thomas Keen's, Special Motion to Dismiss Pursuant to G.L. c. 231, § 59H, the anti-SLAPP statute.

### II. INTRODUCTION

Plaintiff, Ourway Realty, LLC d/b/a Plainridge Racecourse ("Ourway") is a harness horse racing facility located in Plainville, Massachusetts known as Plainridge Racecourse. Plainridge Racecourse has been operating at this site for over thirteen years. Ourway has recently filed with the Massachusetts Gaming Commission (the "Commission") its prequalification application with its \$400,000 non-refundable application fee seeking to be awarded the so-called Class 2 license to operate along with its harness horse racing operation, one thousand two and hundred and fifty (1,250) slot machines, pursuant to the recently enacted

Massachusetts Gamin Act, referred to as Chapter 194 of the Acts of 2011 (the "Gaming Act").

Only one such Class 2 license is available for granting in the Commonwealth.

Ourway has sought and received site permits to expand its present seventy-two thousand (72,000) square foot facility by approximately three hundred thousand (300,000) square feet, including the construction of a one thousand (1,000) car above-ground parking garage. All of these permits have been issued and are well beyond any appeal periods associated with same. The 21.6 million dollar parking garage is presently under construction and through its construction, is employing approximately eight (800) hundred union laborers. (Together the present facility and expanded facility are hereinafter referred to as the "Facility").

Defendant, Thomas Keen ("Keen") is a resident of Plainville, Massachusetts. Keen is an opponent to Ourway's proposal to operate a gaming facility in Plainville, Massachusetts. Keen has established a website and Facebook page entitled "No Plainville Racino", voicing his and others opposition to expanded gaming. As set forth in this memorandum, Ourway, while it disagrees with Keen's position, does not oppose open and spirited dialogue on this issue. In fact, the evidence demonstrates that Ourway has encouraged such a dialogue and invited public comment on this issue (see Affidavit of Gary T. Piontkowski attached hereto as Exhibit A).

The evidence demonstrates that Keen was not engaged in petitioning activities that are protected by the statute, and in fact, when an alleged specific crime occurred at his home, he and his wife suggested and intimated that it was connected with the operations of Ourway. Contrary to the allegations and assertions as set forth in Keen's motion and memorandum in support of his special motion to dismiss, the complaints are not based upon Keen's petitioning activities. The statute was not designed to protect the complained or conduct of Keen. Accordingly, Keen's special motion to dismiss should be denied and this matter should move forward.

## II. $FACTS^1$

The following facts are drawn from the Plaintiff's complaint and the supporting Affidavits of Gary T. Piontkowski and William Lamb.

Ourway operates a harness horse racing facility located in Plainville, Massachusetts.

Ourway has been in existence for thirteen (13) years and is known as Plainridge Racecourse (see Exhibit A, Affidavit of Gary T. Piontkowski). When the facility is open, there is always a police presence. Ourway operates live racing from April to November and simulcasting throughout the year (see Exhibit A, Affidavit of Gary T. Piontkowski).

Ourway has supported legislation for the expansion of gaming in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Ourway intends to file an application for a license for so-called Class 2 gaming at the Facility and has received permits to allow expansion at the Facility (see Exhibit A, Affidavit of Gary T. Piontkowski). On August 9, 2012, Ourway filed a non-refundable application fee of \$400,000 with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for said Class 2 gaming. The only other paid-in applicant before the Commission is Suffolk Downs, but it seeks a so-called Class 1 license, which encompasses a full variety of gaming, including slots, table games, etc. (see Exhibit A, Affidavit of Gary T. Piontkowski).

Ourway has and continues to address local concerns associated with its bid to expand gaming at the Facility. At no time during these discussions has Ourway discouraged the voicing of concerns from being heard. Ourway has rented office space in the Town of Plainville and has offered, at a public hearing, that anyone who wishes to use the office to voice their concerns may use an office within the space at no cost and Ourway provides them a telephone (see Exhibit A,

Affidavit of Gary T. Piontkowski). This is done to encourage a complete and open dialogue on these important issues (see Exhibit A, Affidavit of Gary T. Piontkowski).

Keen, along with several residents, started a site on Facebook known as "NoPlainvilleRacino" (see Exhibit B, hereinafter the "Site"). The Site was established on March 25, 2012 and is openly dedicated to those opposing expanded gaming in Plainville.<sup>2</sup> At no time did Ourway object to this website or seek to prevent it or individuals posting to it expressing their opinions (see Exhibit A, Affidavit of Gary T. Piontkowski).

In March of 2012, Keen, one of the operators of the website, had a second break-in at his home (see Affidavit of Thomas Keen attached to the Defendant's Special Motion to Dismiss and Exhibit C Affidavit of William Lamb). Keen lives one-half mile from the Facility. After the first break-in at his home, Keen installed a webcam at his home. Evidently during the second breakin at his home, Keen's webcam caught an image of the alleged perpetrator. Keen posted that image on the Site on March 28, 2012, three days after it was launched. That image remains there to this day (see Exhibit B, p. 19). The image on the Site stated that the break-in happened on Route 152 which is very close to the Facility. The Keens immediately believed the crime was done by Plaintiff in retaliation to their position on gaming and posted the image of the suspected perpetrator (see Exhibit C, Affidavit of William Lamb). That image of a crime on the Site devoted to the opposition to the expansion of gaming at the Plaintidge Racecourse associates a direct link between Ourway and that specific crime (see Exhibit A, Affidavit of Gary T. Piontkowski).

Initially, there was a comment on the Site underneath the photograph which stated that they should check with individuals at Plainridge Racecourse to find the individual displayed in

the image. That comment has been removed from the Site after Keen received correspondence regarding it from Plaintiff's counsel.

Ourway initiated its complaint to seek to have the image of the individual removed from the Site in addition to the comment. The image suggests a defamatory per se association with a specific crime to the Facility. Keen was not engaging in petitioning activities when he posted information relating to an alleged crime that occurred at his home on the Site. The photograph directly and overtly associates a felony had occurred a short distance from the Plainridge Racecourse with Ourway. Mr. Keen was not making a statement directed to any governmental or judicial body nor did he engage in petitioning activity protected by the statute and therefore, the motion must be denied.

#### III. ARGUMENT

# A. The Anti-SLAPP Statute Does Not Provide Blanket Protection To Defendant Or An <u>Absolute Privilege</u>

The Massachusetts anti-SLAPP statute, G.L. c. 231, § 59H, allows a party to bring a special motion to dismiss when it asserts that a civil claim, counterclaim or cross motion brought against it is based on the parties' "exercise of its rights as a petition under the Constitution of the United States or the Commonwealth." See G.L. c. 231, § 59H.

In order to be granted protection under the anti-SLAPP statute, the moving party must establish two initial showings: (1) that activities in which the claims against it are based on "a petitioning activity" within the meaning of the statute; and (2) that the claims have no substantial basis other than or in addition to the petitioning activities. See *Duracraft Corp. v. Holmes Products Corp.* 427 Mass. 156, 167-68 (1998).

The Massachusetts legislature intended the anti-SLAPP statute to encourage "full participation by persons and organizations and robust discussions of issues 'before legislative, judicial and administrative bodies." See Kobrin v. Gastfriend, 443 Mass. 327, 337 (2005). Emphasis added. However, the legislature never intended the anti-SLAPP statute to be an absolute privilege. See Duracraft at 427 Mass. 162-63; see also Fustolo v. Hollander, 455 Mass. 861, 870 (2010).

As discussed below, Keen fails to establish in his motion to dismiss that the actions complained of are petitioning activities. He fails to establish that in doing so he satisfied any of the statutory functional definitions of petitioning activity. More particularly, Keen was: (1) not petitioning on his own behalf as a citizen or was seeking redress from the government from his own grievances when he posted the picture of a crime at his home and associated it with the Plaintiff; (2) none of Keen's activities by posting the picture of a suspected criminal and crime and associating that with the Plaintiff constituted "a written or oral statement made before or submitted to a legislative, executive or judicial body or any governmental proceeding"; (3) that this picture constituted a written or oral statement made in connection with an issue under consideration or review by a legislative, executive or judicial body or any other governmental proceeding; (4) that the picture was addressed to any governmental activity and there is no evidence from which to infer that the posting of the picture of a criminal suspect was "reasonably likely to encourage consideration or review for an issue before a legislative, executive or judicial body, or any governmental proceeding"; and (5) in posting of a picture of a suspected criminal Keen did not call upon members of the public to engage or enlist in public participation. In essence, Keen's position seeks to create an absolute privilege under the anti-SLAPP statute that any type of comment on a website where the issues are public, regardless of their nature, are

protected by the anti-SLAPP statute, which is contrary to the intent of the legislature and the decisions of the Supreme Judicial Court.

If this Court were to adopt the Defendant's position, then any individual could go onto any website regarding pending legislation and make comments or insinuations unassociated with the purpose of the site, such as baseless accusations of accusing their opponents of a crime or harboring criminals and then hide behind the statute. That was not the intention of the statute. Moreover, a statement or posting of the crime and attempting to connect it to the Plaintiff is not "reasonably likely to encourage review" by any governmental entity and does not seek redress before a governmental entity. See *Fustolo v. Hollander*, 455 Mass. 861, 865-67 (2010).

## B. Keen Was Not Engaged In Petitioning Activity On His Own Behalf

The Massachusetts courts have repeatedly enforced the requirement of the anti-SLAPP statute such that it can only be granted when the claims at issue are based on a party's right to petition on their own behalf. As the Supreme Judicial Court held in *Fustolo v. Hollander* and *Kobrin v. Gastfriend*, the anti-SLAPP statute is limited to "those defendants who petition the government on their own behalf. In other words, the statute is designed to protect the overtures to the government by a party's positioning their status as citizens." See *Kobrin*, 443 Mass. at 332. Therefore, a defendant can claim protection under the anti-SLAPP statute only if the conduct in question "amounted to the exercise of the right to petition the government as that concept as it is understood in the context of our state and federal constitutions." *Fisher v. Lindt*, 69 Mass. App. Ct. 360, 364 (2007). The Supreme Judicial Court has recognized that the anti-SLAPP statute is designed and explicitly and exclusively extends protection to a party only when the party's activities are based on "said party's right to petition." See *G.L. c. 231*, § 59H.

The statute provides protection to a party based upon the party's exercise of his own rights to petition under the Constitution and restricts the statute's coverage to those defendants who petition the government on their own behalf. Thus, the right to petition contemplated by the statute is one in which a party seeks some redress from the government for their own party's grievances. *Kobrin*, 443 Mass. at 333.

The publication in question here contains a photograph of a "B&E suspect. About 10 am. Pville rt. 152. If u know this person, please msg us." Keen was not exercising his right to petition by posting or allowing this post; he was stating that a crime had occurred at his home and was directly linking that crime to Plainridge Racecourse. Keen, evidently believed the Plaintiff was somehow behind the crime (see Exhibit C, Affidavit of William Lamb). Other posts on the Site do express opinions and concerns regarding the expansion of gaming at Plainridge Racecourse. See MacDonald v. Paton, 57 Mass. App. Ct. 290 (2003). The Plaintiff's action is neither based on those posts nor does it seek to prevent that type of dialogue (see Exhibit A, Affidavit of Gary T. Piontkowski). It is based on the posting of a specific crime and associating it with the Plaintiff without any evidence in an effort to defame the Plaintiff. The posting of the crime does not advance the purported purpose of the Site.

It is clear that Keen was attempting to link the felony at his home with the Plaintiff in an effort to defame and smear the Plaintiff. Keen, as his affidavit states, has both an undergraduate degree with honors from Bucknell and an MBA from Harvard University in Cambridge, Massachusetts, suggesting a high level of intelligence and sophistication. Given this, anyone would be hard-pressed to suggest he did not fully know what he was doing and why. Moreover, Keen in his memorandum states that the "NoPlainvilleRacino" website and Facebook page can also be expected to have a direct influence on public officials because they supply substantial

information and argument on why a racino would harm Plaintiff's interests" (see Defendant's memorandum, p. 11). Defendant's intentions are quite clear – he makes baseless accusations associating a crime at his home to the Plaintiff in order to prevent gaming from expanding at Plainridge Racecourse and he then attempts to hide his intentions behind the anti-SLAPP statute arguing that he was engaging in petitioning activities because of the purported purpose of the website. That rationale should not be permitted. Furthermore, the posting of the photograph did not advance or advocate the alleged purpose of the Site and therefore, Keen should not be allowed to have the blanket protection he requests.

Defendant's position would allow anyone claiming a general interest in matters before a legislative, executive or judicial body, to make a comment unassociated with those issues, such as committing a crime, and seek unqualified protection under the anti-SLAPP statute. The legislature never intended for the anti-SLAPP statute to have such broad sweeping application. In fact, such broad sweeping construction was rejected by the Supreme Judicial Court in *Kobrin*. The statute was not designed to protect someone from making a direct link from a specific personal crime that occurred at his home and associating that crime with an individual to be protected under the anti-SLAPP statute on the premise that he was engaged in petitioning activities. The Site specifically states that it is a group of citizens opposed to the expansion of gaming at Plainridge Racecourse. The posting of the image does not advance this purpose and nowhere in Defendant's memorandum does he suggest that he does further that cause.

The Site expresses its opposition to gaming and the purported effects it could have on a community. The Plaintiff's action is not based upon those statements. Rather, it is based upon a defamatory statement associating a specific crime with the facility operated by Ourway.

Massachusetts courts have long recognized accusing one of a crime to libel/defamation. See *Ravnikar v. Bogojavlensky*, 438 Mass. 627, 630-31 (2003).

Ourway has a right to petition the Commission for the Class 2 license – and it likewise has a right to seek that license unfettered by defamatory statements made by those who seek to oppose that application. Keen has the evident intelligence and sophistication to address his concerns based upon facts, studies and credible evidence, not on ludicrous assertions based on objectionable ramblings. However, it appears that Keen's wife likewise believes that the "Track" is out to get them – there is no evidence of this, it is in fact contrary to the evidence here, and smacks of a vendetta by the Keens to harm the Facility and Ourway (*see Exhibit C, Affidavit of William Lamb*).

## C. Ourway Can Sustain Its Burden

If this Court were to determine that Keen was engaged in petitioning activity, the activity which is complained of was "devoid of any factual support or any arguable basis in law" and that as a defamatory conduct associating a crime with the Plaintiff, caused damage to the Plaintiff.

See G.L. c. 231, § 59H; see also Ravnikar v. Bogojavlensky, 438 Mass. 627, 630-31 (2003).

Keen's memorandum expends considerable time on the fact that Keen's website and statements on "NoPlainvilleRacino.com" have a factual basis in law. As stated before, and in the affidavit of Mr. Piontkowski, it is not the website or those comments regarding racing, gambling and the purported effects on a community which the Plaintiff is basing its action. Rather, it is the specific statement that Keen attempted to have a crime at his home associated with the Plaintiff by posting a picture and comment in an effort to defame and smear the Plaintiff (see Exhibit A, Affidavit of Gary T. Piontkowski; see also Exhibit C, Affidavit of William Lamb). There is

simply no basis or factual support for Keen to make a break-in at his home directly or indirectly associated with the Plaintiff and its operations. Nor does Keen in his memorandum seek to establish that these activities had any basis in fact or law. Instead he spends considerable time on the purpose of the Site and studies on the purported effect of gambling on communities. These are not the complained of activities by the Plaintiff. Furthermore, since this is a libel/slander/defamation action, the Plaintiff can show actual injury and potential damage to its reputation. See *Stone v. Essex County Newspaper, Inc.*, 367 Mass. 849, 860-61 (1975). In the within matter, the injury of associating a crime with a public entity that has made an application with the State Racing Commission satisfies this prong (*see Exhibit A, Affidavit of Gary T. Piontkowski*).

#### IV. <u>CONCLUSION</u>

For the foregoing reasons, the Plaintiff respectfully requests this Honorable Court deny the Defendant's special motion to dismiss in its entirety.

#### AFFIDAVIT OF GARY T. PIONTKOWSKI

I, Gary T. Piontkowski, being duly sworn do hereby depose and state as follows:

- 1. I am making this affidavit on my own personal knowledge of the events and transactions of this matter.
- 2. I have been associated as a breeder, owner and harness horse participant for over thirty-five (35) years.
- 3. During that time, I have bred and/or owned over 100 standardbred horses, and raced them throughout the United States.
- 4. I was honored several years ago to be named to the Harness Horse Racing Hall of Fame in New England.
- 5. I have owned and operated a breeding farm in Belchertown, MA.
- 6. In 1991, I was appointed by Governor William F. Weld, Chairman of the Massachusetts State Racing Commission, which position I held for approximately two (2) years.
- 7. Thereafter, I became the Vice President and General Manager of Foxboro Harness, which operated where the new Gillette stadium now stands.
- 8. In 1997, I petitioned for a license for a harness horse operation in Plainville, MA.
- 9. After hearings before the Town of Plainville and the Massachusetts State Racing Commission, we were awarded the license to operate Plainridge Racecourse, and have done so since that time.

- 10. Plainridge Racecourse is a state of the art facility dedicated to safe, effective, and properly operated racing that matches any such racing conducted here or abroad. That facility opened March 17, 1999.
- 11. Whenever the Plainridge Racecourse is open, there is a police officer present from the Town of Plainville. The Massachusetts State Police also have an office on site as well as other state entities.
- 12. Plainridge Racecourse operates live racing from April to November each year and simulcasting throughout the year.
- 13. I have long been a proponent of the expansion of gaming within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
- 14. And I have made it clear that Plainridge Racecourse, if gaming was passed by the Massachusetts legislature, would be an applicant to operate a gaming facility at Plainridge Racecourse.
- 15. On or about August 9, 2012, Ourway Realty, LLC filed an application for a so-called Class 2 license under the new gaming act passed in 2011.
- 16. I have attended numerous meetings of various boards in the Town of Plainville and at the State House.
- 17. I am familiar with Thomas Keen and other opponents to the expansion of gaming at Plainridge Racecourse.
- 18. I have always welcomed an open dialogue between Ourway Realty. LLC and the residents of Plainville, so that we can both exist harmoniously together as I have done since Plainridge Racecourse opened its doors thirteen years ago.
- 19. I have attended numerous town wide and board meetings to answer questions and share information and we have never shied away from opening our doors to those who wish to view our facility and speak to the issues at hand.
- 20. In March of 2012, Plainridge Raccourse rented space in the Town of Plainville where it maintains an office. The purpose of this office is to allow easy access to information about our intentions and to allow citizens of the Town of Plainville to express their views openly.
- 21. At a Town of Plainville Selectmen's meeting I stated to Mrs. Mary Ann Grenier, a long-time vocal opponent to the expansion of gaming at Plainridge Racecourse, that I would provide her and her group an office and telephone at this same location at no cost, so that the opponents' position could also be heard and disbursed to the citizens.

- 22. We, being the owners, employees and racing participants have worked tirelessly to make Plainridge successful and to promote its continued existence, expansion and the employment that it encompasses.
- 23. Plainridge in its present operations provides employment and compensation to approximately 1,600 families in Massachusetts, and expanded gaming at our facility will increase that dramatically.
- 24. I am aware of the "No Plainville Racino" site on Facebook and while I disagree with its position, I have done nothing to prevent it from operating and expressing its beliefs.
- 25. Shortly after it was established by its own account in March 2012, it printed a picture of a crime that occurred a short distance from the racetrack.
- 26. This image was of a suspected individual who evidently was associated with a B&E at Mr. Keen's home which is located on Route 152.
- 27. My opposition to this photograph is that it associates a specific crime with a website designed to prevent the expansion of gaming at Plainridge Racecourse and that specific crime had nothing to do with, nor were there any facts to support, that it was connected with Plainridge Racecourse.
- 28. I have requested, through my attorney, that the image be removed along with the comment associated with it. I have not requested nor do I seek to have any other materials on the facebook page removed nor do I wish to prevent an open dialogue on the issues regarding gaming at Plainridge Racecourse.
- 29. Much of the website is designed toward studies based upon crime and gaming at other facilities throughout the country. Those are generic studies and to my belief, none of those studies link Plainridge Racecourse with a specific crime.
- 30. Mr. Keen's assertion of an alleged crime being committed at his home on his website is not targeted towards the issues, but rather is being done to defame Plainridge Racecourse based upon the fact that a crime occurred a very short distance from our facility.
- 31. Despite my request that the image be removed, it still exists on the website today.
- 32. Plainridge is harmed by Mr. Keen's assertions we have recently paid the Commonwealth \$400,000 in a non-refundable payment associated with our Class 2 application.
- 33. We are spending millions of dollars in constructing a parking garage, and to date, have expended over five million (\$5,000,000) dollars in engineering and professional expenses associated with our application process.

34. Public dialogue and concerns have been and will always be a part of our business - and we have acted to allow it, and given it voice, but we are proud of our record and crime is not part of it, whether it is sheltering those who illegally break into people's homes or otherwise.

#### Affidavit of William Lamb

The undersigned, **William Lamb**, hereby deposes and states under the pains and penalties of perjury as follows:

- 1. My name is William Lamb and I am employed as a Police Officer in the Town of Plainville Police Department (the "Department").
- 2. I have been employed as police officer in the Town of PlaInville for 28 years.
- 3. I reside at 7 Fletcher, Plainville, MA.
- 4. I am familiar with Plainridge Racecourse, which is located on Washington Street, in Plainville, MA (the "Track").
- 5. I am familiar with Mr. and Mrs. Jennifer Keen who reside at 50 Taunton, Plainville, MA.
- 6. On or about March 28, 2012, the Keens reported a break-in at their home and an investigation was conducted.
- 7. I was on scene two times discussing the break ins with Mrs. Keen. On the second visit Mary-Ann Grenier was present.
- 8. On March 28, 2012 with Mary-Ann Grenier present, Mrs. Keen stated "I would not be surprised that the track had someone do this break in retallation for our anti-gaming stance." I stated I find that hard to believe the track has to much invested to be involved in anything like a house break.
